# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As we come into the summer break, there will be more work carried out at the school. Two new large pergolas will be built on the St Albans Rd side of the oval, in the middle two of the six concrete stands that have been built by Padstow TAFE. A large mural will be painted on the wall facing the oval, and several rooms will have more printed blinds put in, bringing the total number to 24 rooms across the school. The staff toilets in J block will also be refurbished and the garden bed on the container facing Ffrench's Forest will be completed. We have invested heavily in the first stage of the hall upgrade with new LED lights on the stage and main hall to be hopefully installed during the break as well.

Perhaps the biggest project will be the completion of the Innovation Hub which is currently being built off site and should be installed by mid-January. It will take us at least the first part of term 1 to fit the room, and with some luck the hub will be open for students soon after. I would like to thank my staff for what has been a challenging year, especially Mr Mckeown who was supported during the year by Ms Ellis, Mr Rozario and Ms Noulas as relieving Deputies in the absence of Ms Bardouh who will return to the school in 2021.

## SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

As we come into the summer break, there will be more work carried out at the school, including the innovation hub, new pergolas, a mural, new blinds and gardens, and the hall upgrade.



Finally, I would like to take this time to acknowledge Ms Linda Chegwiddden who is retiring after 33 years - the last 27 years at Kingsgrove North High School. Ms Chegwiddden has made a major contribution to the school during this time with her passion and involvement in many areas of school life. She has initiated many programs and held several positions including year advisor, prefect coordinator and presentation day organiser to name a few. She has been Head Teacher HSIE since 2010 and during her time has changed the lives of many students who keep in contact with her. On behalf of the staff and school community I would like to wish her all the best in her retirement and thank her for her service to public education..

# INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS DUBBO EXCURSION



On the 23rd November, 19 International Year 11 and 10 students boarded the school bus for a 3 day trip to regional NSW. Along with Ms Ellis and Mr Celenk, they headed for Dubbo Zoo with stops at Molong and Lithgow.

Arriving at Dubbo Zoo, we went to the Billabong Camp and found our tents for the night. This was followed by a BBQ dinner before heading out into the night to see the Australian animal enclosure. We were able to see 3 species of wallabies, koalas and quokkas. Returning to camp for the night where the lion could be heard throughout the night talking to the lionesses.



An early start the next morning with a walk around the Zoo before it opened, looking at several types of primates, the hippo and the tiger. We saw the tiger being fed. The camp part of the excursion was finished and we hired bikes to ride around the Zoo for the morning looking at all the other animals. After lunch, we re-boarded the bus and went to Parkes to observe the Radio Telescope. We were lucky enough to see it move 90 degrees. The telescope receives radio waves from Space and transmits this information to Scientists for analysis. After the hour, we re-boarded the bus and headed back to our cabin accommodation for another BBQ dinner and relaxation.

After a good night's sleep, we hopped on the bus for an early start for our trip back to Kingsgrove North with stops at Wellington and Lithgow.

## Work Placement 2020 & COVID 19

Students undertaking VET courses in 2020 will remain eligible for the Preliminary or HSC credit units if unable to complete work placement. Students commencing a 240-hour, 300-hour or 360-hour VET course in 2020 that has a mandatory work placement requirement, who will continue the course in 2021, will meet the course requirement if they complete 35 hours of work placement. For most courses this is a reduced requirement. It is anticipated that the placement will be completed later in 2021.

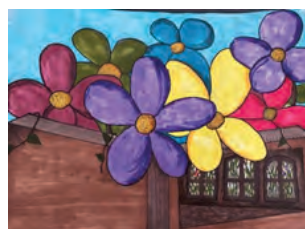

# CAPA NEWS



We have had another busy and productive term, with our CAPA students continuing to demonstrate creativity and dedication to their learning. Stage 4 Year 7 Visual Arts have focused on numeracy and symmetry as a focus in one of our 'Fantastic Animals' tasks. Students created insects using symmetry, space, dimensions and time. The task was a huge success with our students enjoying the process and end results.

Year 9 Visual Arts students completed mural artwork designs for a site-specific area within Kingsgrove North High School, as next year we will be working collaborative to paint and display their murals around the school. The students were engaged and excited and are looking forward to working together to create their paintings.



Year 10 Photography and Digital Media students created optical illusion digital manipulated photographs using Photoshop. This was a fun and interactive activity that engaged our students' achievement of learning outcomes.

Year 10 Visual Arts have been exploring the Pop Art Movement, creating artworks through a variety of mediums. Students have used ICT like Photoshop to create Lichtenstein inspired works focusing on current Pop culture icons. Students have been exploring the subject matter of Still Life and Pop Culture branding through the visual aspects of Pop Art and have been creating artwork proposals for their ideal work. Students have been inspired by Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein and Claes Oldenburg in their design process.



On Wednesday 18th November, 2020 Year 11 Visual Arts students who have begun their year 12 learning journey had the wonderful opportunity to experience the Van Gogh Alive Sydney immersive exhibitions. The students thoroughly enjoyed the virtual projection and were able to experience art in a new and exciting way.



# CAPA NEWS



This semester Year 11 PVD students explored photo manipulation through the concept of 'Combining the Bizarre'. Students used the newly renovated photo studio, learning the impact of lighting and using lighting tents to photograph one bizarre element. Through Photoshop students adapted and distorted images to reimagine these wacky and wonderful creations.

While most of the school was winding down in December, Year 12 2021 students were hard at work completing their first HSC Music assessment task. Students were asked to compose and notate an original song, as well as complete a viva voce about a musical topic. For most students, this was their first time completing a viva voce, which is part presentation and part discussion on a chosen topic. This was a big task for students to complete. Nonetheless they delivered some promising tasks that demonstrated compositional and musicological skills.



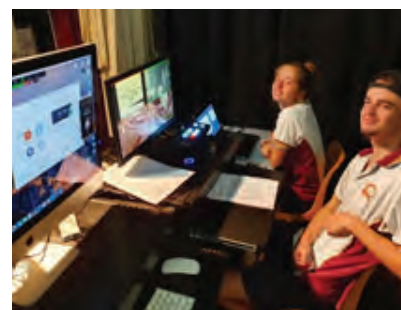

Room DGLC has been undergoing a renovation into a music studio classroom with new recording and sound production equipment and sound treatment. This upgrade of the room should be completed by Term 1, 2021.

As this has been a tumultuous year, many performance events that typically occur have had to be postponed till next year, or adjusted. Ceremonial events such as presentation day and graduation have had to be live-streamed with reduced audience numbers. The sound and light team have quickly adapted to new technological challenges under the direction of Mr O'Connell and Mr Kurt to ensure that these events continue despite big adjustments. Also, starting fresh in 2021, the school band will be rehearsing from early Term 1. As we have approached the final stages of term 4 2020, I would encourage CAPA students to continue to thrive and be committed to their learning in the next stages of their courses for 2021. 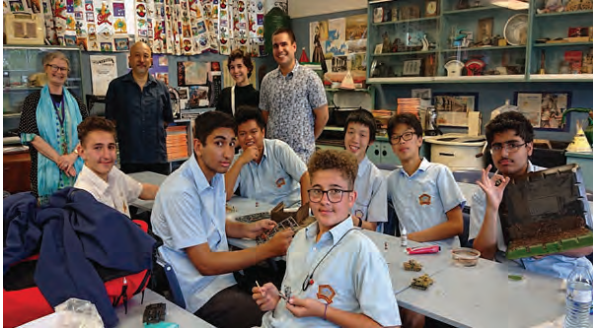

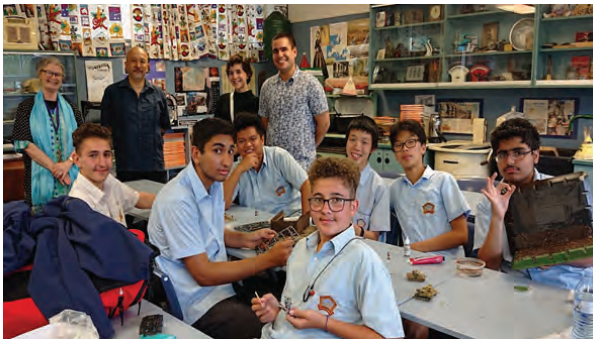


# MODEL MAKING & POLITICAL SCIENCE CLUBS

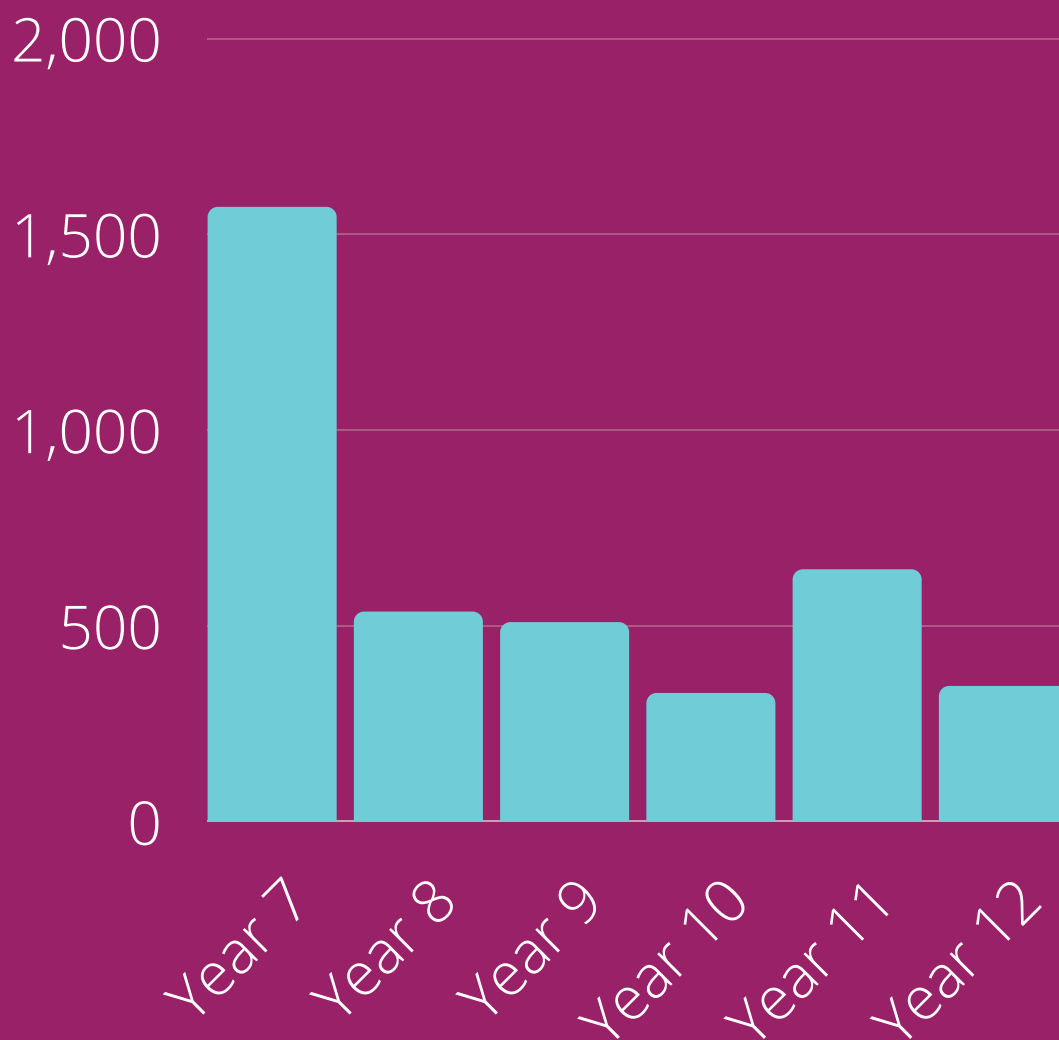
